## **Getting there**

South Park is in Darlington.

There are several entrances to the park, however there are two main entrances to the festival activity.

- 1. Parkside Entrance (use postcode DL1 5TG)
- 2. Victoria Embankment Entrance (use postcode DL1 5JS)

# Information Point / Hullabaloo Hub

There will be a Hullabaloo Hub near both entrances where you can get all of the information you need about the festival and to book your tickets. This will be a Theatre Hullabaloo branded white gazebo. Come and see us if you have any questions or need help.

There is a lost child point at both hubs.

# **Disabled** parking

Blue badge holders should follow the usual guidelines around parking, and it is the responsibility of the badge holder to park appropriately.

There are some disabled parking spaces at the Parkside Entrance to the park. As a blue badge holder, you may be entitled to park on the double yellow lines outside of all entrances to South Park providing there are no loading restrictions in that area, allowing you to park here for up to 3 hours when displaying the time clock and badge. Blue badge holders cannot park in loading/unloading bays.

## Wheelchair access

All of the performance spaces ("stages") can be reached by a wheelchair via well maintained concrete paths all the way around the park. All information points and the Welfare Tent will be right on the concrete paths.

The accessible step-free routes (for wheelchairs and buggies) have been identified on the Festival Map but if you are unsure, just ask one of our lovely festival staff members and they can assist you. It may take longer to use the step-free routes around the park, so you may need to allow for a little extra time to arrive for a performance or activity.

There are some gentle slopes on the step free route shown on the map.

Although the paths leading to all stages are wheelchair accessible, the performance spaces themselves are all on grass. There will be plastic flooring on the Dragonfly Stage and near the Food Vendors and Family Picnic Area shown on the Festival Map so these spaces will be accessible to wheelchair users.

All activity on the Ladybird Stage is accessible to wheelchairs as it will be visible from all concrete paths in that area and there will be no need to move on to the grass for this stage.

# **Disabled toilets**

South Park and all of the permanent facilities within it are managed by Darlington Borough Council. This includes the toilets and café. There is one ungendered accessible toilet in this toilet block, and you may need a key from the café to access this.

In addition to the toilets provided by the council, there will be portaloos available for people attending the festival, including a wheelchair-accessible toilet. These toilets will be towards the Victoria Embankment entrance. See the map for more information.

## Assistance dogs

Assistance dogs are welcome across the whole festival. If you need any more information on potential triggers for an assistant dog (for example food, puppets, loud noises), please see a member of the festival staff team or contact us in advance by emailing info@theatrehullabaloo.org.uk or calling us on 01325 405680.

#### **First Aid**

There is a First Aid point at the Welfare tent shown on the map. The Welfare tent is near South park café.

If you feel unwell, ask the first aiders to help you.

## Ear Defenders and Sensory Equipment

We will have ear defenders and sensory equipment available to borrow from each hub.

#### **Distances between 'Stages'**

If you are attending a specific event, we recommend leaving at least 15 minutes to get to the activity/performance you have pre-booked for to allow enough time to find which space the activity is taking place in and for us to check your tickets (if the event is ticketed).

Below are the timings to get to from each entrance:


Parkside entrance to Ladybird stage in the centre of the festival: Approximately 4 minutes




Victoria Embankment to Ladybird stage in the centre of the festival: Approximately 4 minutes



Parkside entrance to Victoria Embankment entrance – whole length of festival/park: 7 minutes



Please note this is likely to take longer if you have children with you.



### British Sign Language (BSL) Interpreted and non-verbal performances

We have one show in this year's programme that has integrated BSL, meaning that the interpreter is also a performer so will be signing in the show rather than standing to one side. We hope this makes the experience more inclusive for everyone.

The show is **Hare & Tortoise**. More information can be found here: <u>www.theatrehullabaloo.org.uk/shows/hare-and-tortoise/</u>

We have one staff member who speaks BSL at Level 2 based at one of our free drop in craft tables. They will be wearing a big badge to identify themselves.

There are also shows in the programme that are largely, if not fully, non-verbal, allowing D/deaf or hearing-impaired audiences to join the experience as well as those where English is not a first language.

#### The Bug Hotel

This show is mostly singing in various languages so will be suitable for audiences who have English as a second language.

As mentioned above, there are some shows that have no or very little spoken word, so these would be suitable for non-English speaking audiences or audiences where English is not their first language.

### Neurodiverse-friendly performances and activities

Although we hope the festival will be accessible to all, we do have specific "neurodiverse friendly" performances and activities where families with additional needs might feel more comfortable.

The performance or activity will not have been changed from the standard version, but by identifying it as "neurodiverse friendly" we hope to provide an inclusive environment where parents and families feel comfortable in that space no matter what their needs. This is because, in theory, every family in that performance has experience with neurodiversity in some form and may be more familiar with the behaviours within these families e.g., more noise or movement.

Anyone is welcome to book tickets for any show or activity that they feel is suitable for them and their family. If they have a neurodiverse child, they do not have to attend the identified "neurodiverse friendly" performance show. Similarly, you do not have to have a neurodiverse person in your group to attend a "neurodiverse friendly" show.

We have three specific neurodiverse-friendly activities in the 2023 festival programme and these are:

## Giant's Picnic

For the neurodiverse-friendly group sessions for our Giant's Picnic, we're offering a 45minute slot on each of the days which enables up to 4 families (where at least 1 child in the family has a neurodiverse condition) to enjoy an adapted session.

The adaptations, in this case, are reduced numbers, a fixed 45-minute time slot and a specific staff member to support this session. Because this is a group session, it is likely to mean that the session includes groups of people who are familiar, so you can investigate the space in your own time.

In addition to the specific neurodiverse-friendly sessions listed above and marked on the website, we hope that families will find a range of activities at the festival to entertain them at an appropriate level.

We know from families that engage with us at The Hullabaloo that one of the barriers to attending activities with a neurodiverse child is often around having a specific time to arrive and participate in an activity. For this reason, we have identified bookable slots for some of our free activities to allow you to plan your visit. These sessions aren't neurodiversefriendly specific shows but are activities to book into as one family group.

For the neurodiverse-friendly sessions in particular, we are able to offer the following:

- pre-show information is available to help you prepare for your visit. This will include more details about the show, for example, if puppets are used, if there is a flashing light sequence, and if there are any sudden loud noises. Where possible, we will also include a Visual Story for the show itself.
- you can peek into the performance space and meet the performers before the show begins (pop us an email at info@theatrehullabaloo.org.uk to arrange this in advance).

# Tickets

If you are attending a ticketed performance or activity, we recommend booking tickets in advance either at box office in person at Darlington Hippodrome, by calling 01325 405405 or visiting our website <u>www.theatrehullabaloo.org.uk/hullabaloo-in-the-park</u>

There may be some tickets available to buy on the day. If you would like to know on the day which shows and activities have tickets available, go to the Parkside Hub and our box office staff will help.

If you have booked a ticket for an event, you do not need to present your ticket on arrival. Instead, we will have a list of names to check off as you arrive. So all you need is the name the tickets are booked under.

You do not need a ticket to attend the festival generally.

### Waiting times and queues

We understand that it can be difficult to wait and queue with your young people, so if you turn up to an activity that is busy and currently has no more room, the staff member there will be able to advise on the next available time. You will then be able to go away and enjoy other areas of the festival and return back at that given time, rather than standing in a queue. If you would prefer to wait, you may do so.

## **Companion tickets**

Companion tickets are for adults with a registered disability who wish to bring another adult to assist and support them in bringing their child(ren) to a performance. A disabled adult is entitled to one free companion ticket.

If you are a disabled adult and are entitled to a complimentary Companion ticket to enable you to bring your child to an activity or show at Hullabaloo in the Park, you can book this ticket with the box office.

Because these tickets are complimentary, they are not available to book online. Instead, these tickets must be booked by contacting our Box Office either in-person at Darlington Hippodrome or over the phone at 01325 405405.
